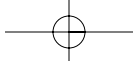

WCCJ is a non-profit organization dedicated to advocacy and comprehensive mental health and substance abuse treatment as an alternative to costly incarceration.

WCCJ works to create a community that embraces the principles of restorative justice by offering mental health and substance abuse treatment and case management services to some of our community's most disadvantaged members, 80% of whom are referred directly from the Buncombe County criminal justice system.

The goal of WCCJ programming is to reduce recidivism among offenders, as well as the necessity for imprisonment, by providing a comprehensive treatment alternative to prison. In so doing, WCCJ keeps families intact, by allowing parents to stay out of prison. Since children with incarcerated parents are 6 times as likely to end up in prison themselves, we improve chances for the next generation. WCCJ saves taxpayer dollars since one day of treatment at WCCJ costs about \$8 compared to \$74 p/day in state prison.

This year WCCJ has experienced an unprecedented growth in new referrals. Agency-wide our greatest concern is having to turn away clients because we don't have the funds with which to serve them.
